 Nuggets from the Panel session "Making Our Voices Heard: Amplifying Women's Visibility and Representation in the Workplace II" where three immigrant women shared their experiences about breaking barriers.

Here are some key points to remember from the panel:

Building Visibility and Relationships

- Start with what you are comfortable with. Then, challenge yourself to join groups or networks and start from there.
- o Build confidence to build relationships and be authentic with it.
- The key is always to show up and participate.
- Personal Brand: Know what your passions are, whether professional or personal. Gain expertise and knowledge in those areas. Then, articulate those and share them in areas where you can add value. In addition, having people focus on your intellectual contributions is really the way to be a value-added member of the team.
- Always have the courage to shine your light! Never dim your light. Always know it's okay
 to bring who you are to the table. Understand that being different is your strength,
 which provides value and perspective to the organization.
- Mentorship and sponsorship are crucial. Having a mentor is invaluable, but more importantly, having a sponsor is much more transformative in your career and being a sponsor.
- You can be your own worst enemy or your best friend. Choose to be your own biggest supporter and best friend! Support yourself to be the best you can be.

Self-Advocacy and Overcoming Barriers

- When negotiating raises and promotions, research industry rates and salaries, know the value you bring to the table, and be confident in your ability to ask for what you want.
- Unconscious bias is present everywhere. It is important to understand that and educate people about these barriers. Be diplomatic and vocal about these biases and use that as an opportunity to educate.
